NOW COME the parties in the above-captioned action, pursuant to Rule .0701 of the Rules of Procedure adopted by the North Carolina Occupational Safety and Health Review Commission, and respectfully show unto the Hearing Examiner as follows:

INCIDENT SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND

On April 10, 2019, a construction crew working as a subcontractor of Respondent punctured a natural gas line in the vicinity of 115 N. Duke Street, Durham, North Carolina, while using a horizontal directional drilling machine. This address was home to several businesses. According to the Durham Fire Department's incident report, the line was compromised at approximately 9:06 a.m.

The first 811 (utility damage prevention line) call regarding the line breach was made by Respondent at 9:28 a.m.; the same caller reached out to 911 at 9:38 a.m. according to Durham emergency dispatch.

At approximately 10:07 a.m., an explosion occurred. There were two fatalities and multiple injuries.

FACTS

- 1. Complainant is an agency of the State of North Carolina charged with the administration and enforcement of the provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of North Carolina, including making inspections and issuing citations and other pleadings, pursuant to N.C.G.S. Article 16, Chapter 95.
- 2. Respondent is a limited liability company duly-organized and operating under the laws of North Carolina.
- 3. Respondent is in the business of telecommunication splicing, installation, fiber, placing, inspection, management, field supervision, and directional drilling.
- 4. Respondent is an "employer" within the meaning of N.C.G.S. §95-127(11); all of Respondent's employees referred to herein are "employees" within the meaning of N.C.G.S. §95-127(11).
- 5. This was a multi-employer worksite.
- 6. Respondent was tasked with boring a path for conduit.
- 7. Respondent subcontracted the boring work to Optic Cable Technology.
- 8. Optic Cable Technology breached a natural gas line.
- 9. Beginning on April 18, 2019, CSHOs from the North Carolina Department of Labor conducted an inspection and investigation of the explosion and this employer.
- 10. As a result of the inspection, one **Serious** citation was issued on October 8, 2019, carrying the following proposed abatement dates and penalties:

- 11. For the alleged violation, the Complainant calculated the proposed penalty and proposed abatement date according to the procedures set forth in the Complainant's North Carolina Operations Manual. Pursuant to Chapter VI, section B of the North Carolina Operations Manual, Complainant applied the following Adjustment Factors to the Gravity Based Penalty of \$7,000.00 to calculate the Proposed Adjusted Penalty, as appropriate: 60% credit for size, 0% credit for good faith, and 10% credit for history, yielding a \$2,100.00 adjusted penalty.
- 12. Respondent submitted a timely Notice of Contest, dated November 25, 2019.
- 13. On or about January 2, 2020, Respondent filed "Employer's/Respondent's Statement of Position," which did not request formal pleadings.
- 14. The parties having reached a Settlement Agreement now seek approval of said Agreement by the Hearing Examiner.

STIPULATIONS

Effective upon approval of this Stipulation and Notice of Settlement, the parties to this action hereby agree and stipulate to the following settlement of the matters at issue herein:

- 1. Respondent agrees that the violations alleged in the Citation and Notification of Penalty, as amended, have been abated, and agrees to continue to use its best efforts to comply with the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of North Carolina (hereinafter referred to as the "Act").
- 2. Complainant agrees to make the following amendment to the Citation and Notification of Penalty:
 - (a) Reclassify Citation 1, Item 001 from SERIOUS to NONSERIOUS.
 - (b) Reduce the penalty for Citation 1, Item 001 by 30% (\$630.00) from \$2,100.00 to \$1,470.00.
- 3. In consideration of this Agreement, the Employer agrees to:

- (a) Continue with its present safety program, including conducting periodic meetings with employees. During such meetings, employees will be able to communicate safety suggestions or complaints to their supervisor who will forward the information to Respondent's safety spokesperson. Respondent agrees to meet regularly with its employees to discuss safety issues and receive safety suggestions or complaints from employees. Respondent's safety spokesperson shall also make recommendations regarding safety to supervisors who will then present such information to employees at the periodic meetings. Respondent agrees that all employees who make suggestions or complaints to the Committee, shall have the same protection provided employees under Article 21, Chapter 95 of the North Carolina General Statutes.
- (b) Ensure that subcontractors it hires have their own safety program that complies with Section 3a.
- (c) Waive its rights under the Occupational Safety and Health Act of North Carolina, N.C.G.S. § 95-126 to -155, to contest any citation item(s), penalty(ies), or abatement date(s) listed on the NCOSHA-2 before the Safety and Health Review Board of North Carolina and/or any other tribunal.
- 4. The parties agree to bear their own attorney's fees, costs and other expenses that have been incurred in connection with any stage of these proceedings up to and including the filing of this Stipulation and Notice of Settlement.
- 5. Upon approval of this Stipulation and Notice of Settlement by the Hearing Examiner, the Respondent agrees to pay the new proposed penalty of \$1,470.00 within ten (10) days following the receipt of the Order approving the Stipulation and Notice of Settlement, by check, payable to North Carolina Department of Labor, OSHA Division (Identifying Inspection No. 318163458) and

mailed to Budget-Collections, North Carolina Department of Labor, 1101 Mail Service Center,

Raleigh, North Carolina, 27699-1101. Credit card payment may also be arranged.

6. The parties agree that this Stipulation and Notice of Settlement is a full and final settlement

of the claims set out in the underlying Citation and Notification of Penalty, and none of the

foregoing agreements, statements, stipulations and actions taken by the Respondent shall be

deemed an admission by the Respondent of any of the allegations contained in the Citation and

Notification of Penalty or waiver of defenses; provided, however, that in any subsequent

proceeding with respect to matters covered by this Stipulation and Notice of Settlement brought

directly under the Act by Complainant, this Agreement shall have the full force and effect of a

final order. The agreements, statements, stipulations and actions herein are made solely for the

purpose of settling this matter economically and amicably without further litigation and shall not

be used for any other purpose except for proceedings and matters arising under the Occupational

Safety and Health Act and Article 21, Chapter 95 of the North Carolina General Statutes.

7. The parties agree that there are no other matters that remain to be decided, and there has

been no employee objection to the reasonableness of any abatement period.

WHEREFORE, the parties to this action hereby respectfully request approval of this

Stipulation and Notice of Settlement.
